

Cohort 4 were invited to attend a celebration to mark 10 years since Baroness Jean Corston wrote her report regarding the treatment of women within the criminal justice system. Beverley and Kristy attended the House of Lords on 7th March and met women's groups from all around the UK, campaign organisations and members of parliament, all joining together to mark the occasion. We were the only group from Warwickshire attending.

Speeches by The Secretary of State Liz Truss, Baroness Corston, Vera Baird PCC and others all voiced a commitment to reduce the imprisonment of women for non violent offences and to treat women according to their lived experience of surviving abuse and mental ill health. Cohort 4 are part of Women's Breakout, a national umbrella representing 56 women's centres across the UK, working with women who present with vulnerabilities and are in contact with, or Who are at risk of coming into contact with the criminal justice process.
